Horizontal Measure

A letter has a horizontal measure, called its *set width*.

The horizontal measure is based on the width of an uppercase M within a typeface.

The square of this width is referred to as em

Kerning

Kerning

Kerning is the process of adding or subtracting space between specific pairs of characters.

If letters in a typeface are spaced too evenly, they make a pattern that doesn't look uniform enough.

Gaps occur around letters whose forms angle outward or frame an open space: W, Y, V, T, L

Types of Kerning

In most digital typefaces used today, the space between letters is controlled by kerning pairs.

Metrics kerning uses kern pairs built into a typeface:

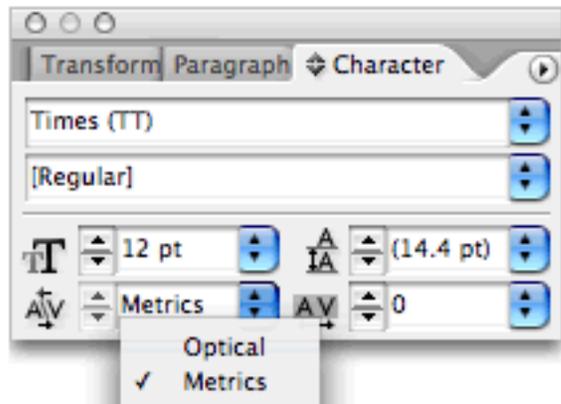
LA, P., To, Tr, Ta, Tu, Te, Ty, Wa, WA, We, Wo, Ya, Yo

Optical kerning adjusts spacing between adjacent characters based on their shapes:

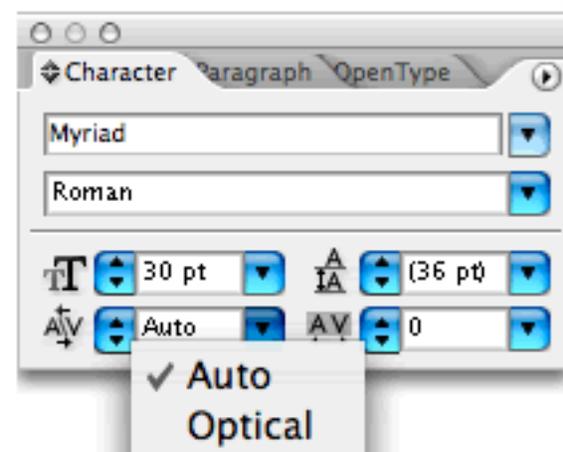
Wednesday (no kerning) *Wednesday* (+100)

In Adobe applications such as Illustrator, Photoshop and InDesign you can automatically kern type using metrics kerning or optical kerning.

InDesign kerning (in character palette)

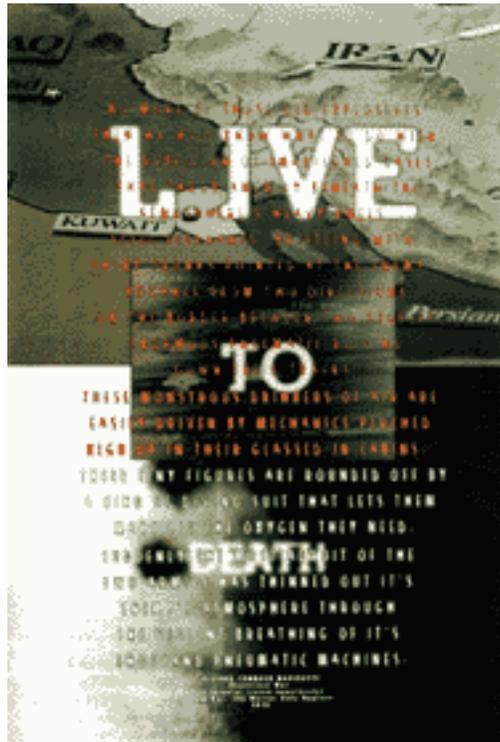


Illustrator kerning (in character palette)



Manual Kerning

Because the space between characters expands as the type size increases, designers must often fine-tune letterspacing when working with large letters.

Spacing is uneven, with gaps around the T and a and the w and o

Takes two

SCALA, WITH KERNING

Spacing is more even

nearly touch

SCALA ITALIC, WITH KERNING SUPPRESSED

Spacing is uneven, with gaps between the l and y

nearly touch

SCALA ITALIC, WITH KERNING

Spacing is more even, italics often requires kerning (typically built into kerning pairs, make sure you check spacing at large sizes)

LOVE LETTERS

SCALA ALL CAPS, WITH KERNING SUPPRESSED

VE and TT combinations make the whole word look mismatched.

SCALA, WITH KERNING

Kerning has been adjusted for a more even appearance

Tracking

Tracking is the process of loosening or tightening entire words, lines or a blocks of text.

Tracking is also measured in 1/1000 of an em

In a 7-point font, 1 em = 7 points

In a 12-point font, 1 em = 12 points

Kerning and tracking are strictly proportional to the current type size.

Tracking

It is common practice to track/letterspace capitals and small capitals. They appear more regal when standing apart.

LOVE LETTERS

SCALA ALL CAPS, WITH NO TRACKING

Letters can be hard to distinguish

LOVE LETTERS

SCALA, WITH +75 TRACKING

You might still need to kern pairs of letters to make the spacing look even.

lowercase

SCALA, WITH NO TRACKING

Lowercase letters are designed to sit closely to one another, occasionally they will need some tracking

l o w e r c a s e

SCALA, WITH +400 TRACKING

Open tracking like this is rarely desirable since the word falls apart

Tracking

Negative tracking is rarely desirable. Use it sparingly, to adjust one or more lines of justified type. Don't use negative tracking to save space.

negative tracking is not effective

SCALA, WITH -50 TRACKING

Letters are too close, readability is compromised.

Courier:

negative tracking (-50)

negative tracking (0)

Tracking

By *slightly* expanding the tracking across a body of text, you can create a more airy field. It's best to start with no tracking, and work from there.

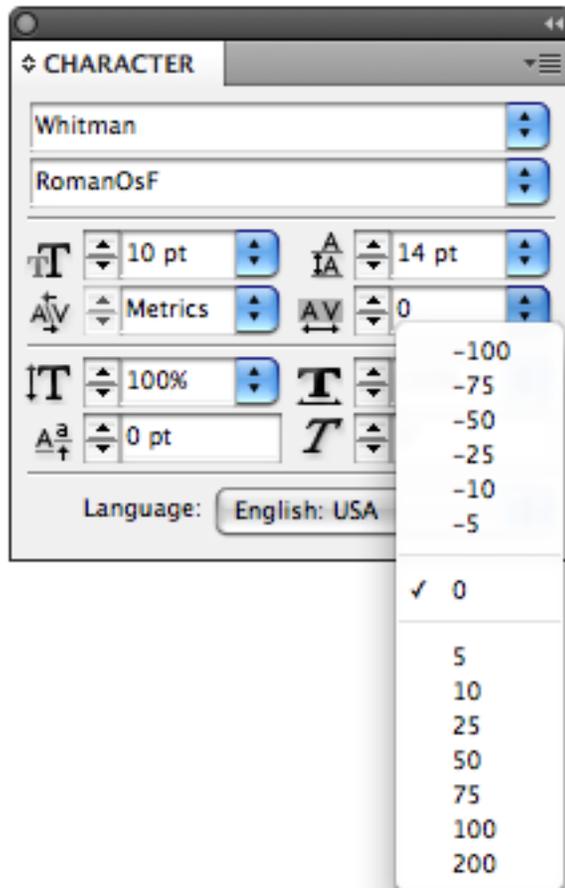

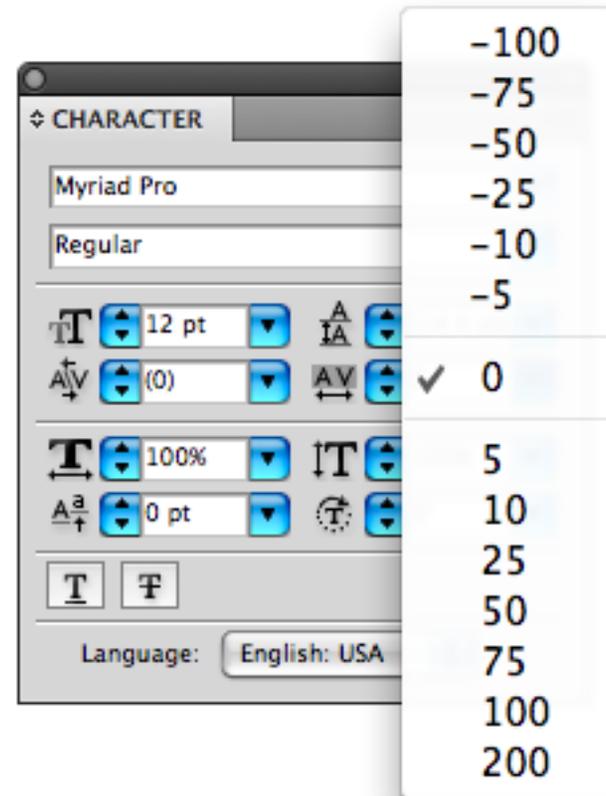

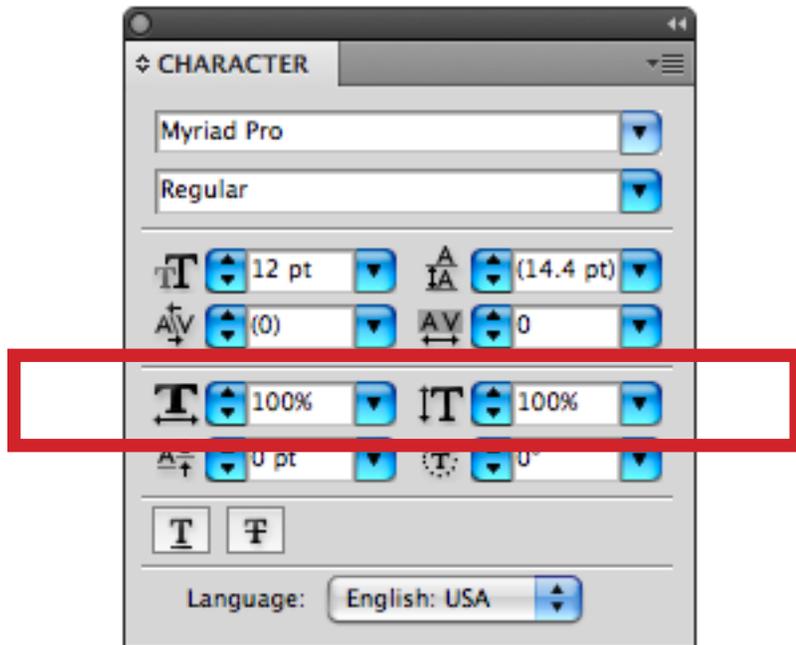


Illustrator tracking (in character palette)

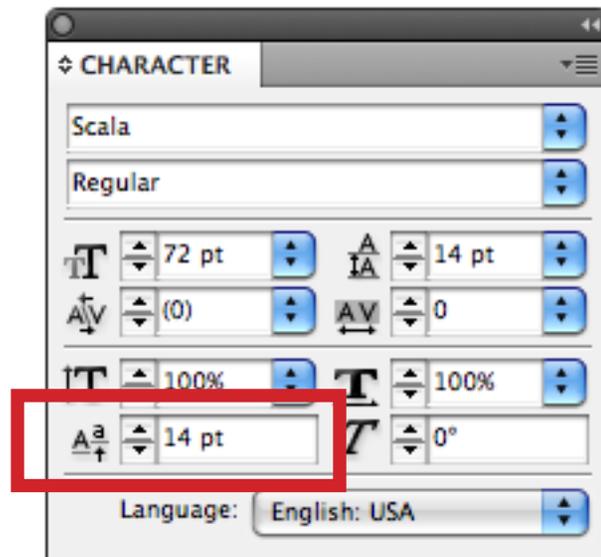
Do not scale your type horizontally or vertically.

Baseline Shift

Use Baseline Shift to raise or lower individual letters (or words as needed). Work in points when using Baseline Shift.

Recap:

Kerning adjusts the space between specific pairs of letters

Tracking adjusts the space over an entire word, line or several paragraphs

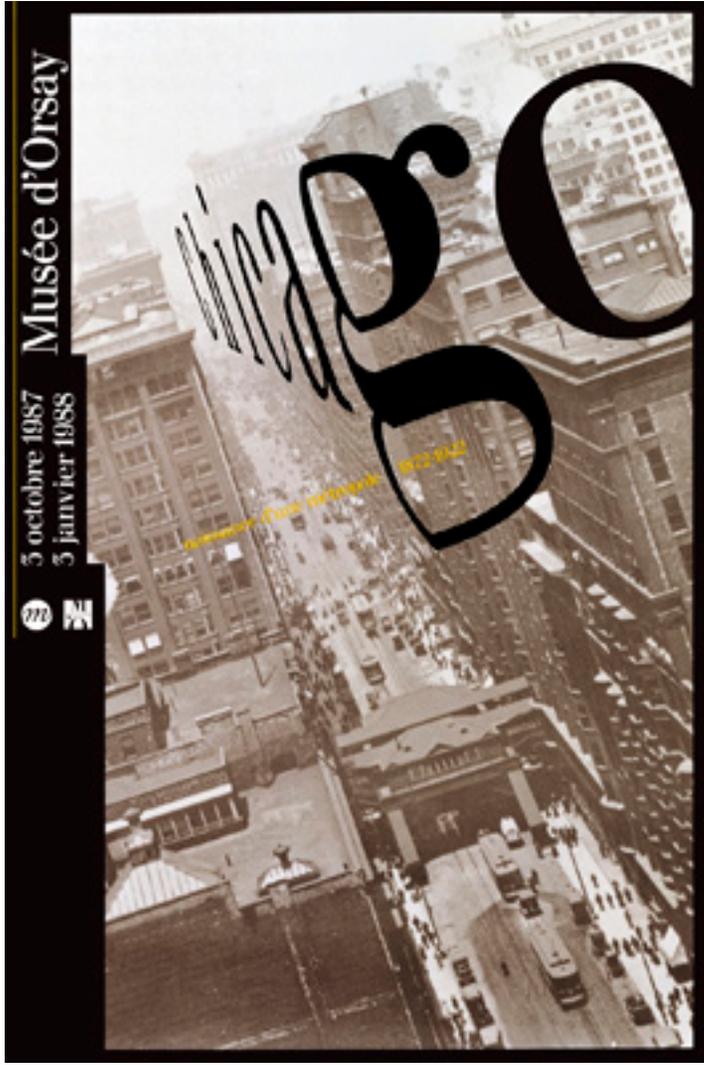
Try to adjust both of these while working on your next project.
